Play-Based Learning as an Inclusive Approach to Early Childhood Education

This presentation centers on how play-based learning is an inclusive approach to early childhood education and describes how play facilitates children's learning by fostering their cognitive, social, and language development. Conference attendees will explore how play provides children with developmentally appropriate exposure to the foundational thinking tools of learning and methods of inquiry within academic subjects.

Lisa Fyffe is an Assistant Professor of Occupational Therapy at Colorado State University. She has a Master of Science in Occupational Therapy. Lisa has extensive experience in pediatrics, working in both primary and secondary education, outpatient therapy, in-home private pediatric practice and in a Level IIIA Neonate Intensive Care Unit. Her current practice and research center on the role of play-based learning in facilitating school readiness and the value of universal access to occupational therapy within early childhood education. Lisa supervises the occupational therapy program at Colorado State University Early Childhood Center, a Reggio-Emilia inspired, play-based school serving children ages six weeks to six years of age.
